STUDENTS SUCCESSFUL AT SECONDARY SCHOOL ENTRANCE EXAMS

Eight students from the Yupukari Primary School [YPS] and six from Quatata Primary school were successful in the Secondary School Entrance Examination [SSEE] written during April this year.

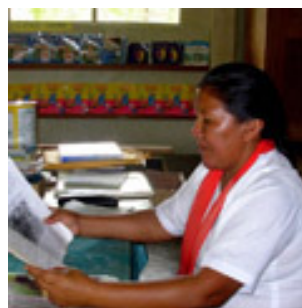
Twenty four students wrote the exam and fourteen were successful. The passes has increased by eleven this year. Last year there were only three passes.

The head teacher for Quatata Primary Sir Dominic Ernest said, "We worked very hard with this batch than last year. We had confidence that we would've gotten many passes. I would really like to thank the teachers for working so hard with the students and also the Yupukari Public Library".

Inez Dorrick the teacher for grade 6 at the Yupukari Primary said, "I'm pleased with the passes this year and I think this is the first time we have ever gotten so many passes.
